

Circle of Significance Within 15% of World's Land Area:

- Over 50% of global population
- 67% of world's UPGs
- 79% of worlds UUPG population
- 29 megacities (10 million+),
 - 200 million more than population of U.S.
- 99% of world's Hindu and Taoists populations, 98% of Buddhists, 92% of Jains, 78% of Sikhs
- 50% of Muslims
- Population of Java Island = 150 million > all of Russia
- Only 4.2% of population is Christian






Rapid Population Growth






2020: 56% of Global Population 2100: 47%






Religious Affiliation

Muslim growth outpacing that of Hindus.




Remarkable Differences by Region








Religious Affiliation in 2020




Islam in Asia (12 Countries)

- Displaced much of Hindu and Buddhist areas along Silk Road and sea trade routes
- 7th 8th centuries: Afghanistan, Pakistan, Turkmenistan, Malaysia, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan
- 12th early 14th centuries: Maldives, Bangladesh, Indonesia, Brunei




Percent of Population that is Muslim: 2020






Distribution of Muslims across Asia: 2020






Growth due to Differential in Fertility






Number of Muslims and Mosques

Hinduism in Asia (2 Countries)

- 2300 BC: Starts in India. Dominant religion in India by 1700 AD.
- Spread throughout Asia initially thru Silk Road Trade routes, then also through sea trade routes
- 2000 BC: Introduced in Nepal. Still dominant religion.
- Displaced initially by Buddhism and then by Islam in much of rest of Asia

Buddhism in Asia (10 Countries)

- Displaced Hinduism along Silk Road and sea trading routes
- 300-209 BC: becomes dominant religion in Sri Lanka, Thailand, Myanmar, and Mongolia
- 3rd-7th century A.D.: Cambodia, Japan, Bhutan, and Laos
- 1624: Taiwan
- 1820: Singapore



Unaffiliated in Asia (4 Countries)

- All formally Buddhist countries
- 1921: Communism begins in China, control by 1927
- 1925: begins in Vietnam, control by 1945
- 1945: begins in N. Korea, control by 1949
- 1964: secularism begins to take root in S. Korea.




Christianity in Asia (2 Countries)

- Recent arrival to Asia, just now having impact
- Spread initially through exploration, trade, and colonialism, followed by missionaries
- 1521: Portuguese missionaries in Philippines
- 1556: Portuguese missionaries in Timor Leste
- 1793-1834: William Carey in India
- 1854-1905: Hudson Taylor in China




Percent of Population that is Christian volent







Distribution of Christians across Asia






Population vs Number of Churches















Reached Status by Asian Country






UUPGs in Asia: Split between Hindus Dec Volente and Muslims






Percent of Asia's Unreached/Unengaged volente






Percent of Muslims that are MBBs; Hindus that are HBBs








UUPG Population per Missionary Dec Volente Received






CPMs and UUPG Population

High Persecution in Asia

- 26% of all Open Doors countries in Asia
- 67% of Asian countries on Open Doors list
- 4 of 11 (36%) of Most Extreme countries in Asia
- North Korea #1 on Open Doors list

- Asia experienced the most remarkable growth of international migrants from 2000 to 2020, at 74 per cent
- More than 40% of all international immigrants born in Asia



Thirteen of the Top Twenty Migrant Streams Start in Asia (2020)






All Countries Eastern Asia more Urban than World Average






Urbanization: Central Asia






Southern Asia still Largely Rural






Mixed Urbanization in South-**Eastern Asia**








Fertility Rates






Widespread Concern for Stability






Varying Levels of Human Development Index




Christian Umma

- Common understanding of who is doing what where



Swimlane: People of Interest

- UUPG population
 - Focus on India, both Muslim and Hindu
- Youth
 - Sports and arts ministries
 - Urban slums
- Muslims
 - Take what is working in Indonesia to scale
 - Take what is working in Kazakhstan to scale
 - Reallocate missionary resources to Muslim majority countries
- Women: family and counseling services



Swimlane: Target Geographics

- Urban Strategy
 - Eastern Asia, mega-cities
 - Drug/alcohol addiction recovery
 - Health due to poor air quality
- Rural
 - Central and South Asia
 - Sustainable/efficient farming. Water management.



Swimlane: Platforms for the Gospel

- Education in South Asia
- Health in countries with lowest HDI (e.g. Afghanistan, Pakistan, India, Bangladesh)
- Family Expansion in Eastern Asia
- Migrant reduction strategies (e.g. job training)
- Environmental emergency response
 - Efficient farming/ranching
 - Water management/usage
 - Drought/flooding assistance
